City -Wide Trash Pickup with Republic Services

The City of Fishers has signed a city-wide contract for residential trash service to go into effect in January 2025. Nearby cities such as Carmel, Noblesville, and Westfield currently have city-wide trash contracts in place. Benefits of a city-wide contract include:

- the ability for the City to assist residents with trash concerns and issues;
- reduced wear on neighborhood roadways;
- a leveraged economies of scale to secure services not currently offered to the majority of residents, such as leaf and landscaping pickup;
- a locked-in rate for 10 years

A full 10-year breakdown is below:

Year I - \$16.39 Year 2 -\$17.33 Year 3 - \$18.32 Year 4 - \$19.38 Year 5 - \$20.51 Year 6 - \$21.72 Year 7 - \$23.00 Year 8 - \$24.36 Year 9 - \$25.82 Year 10 - \$26.89

As a part of the city-wide trash contract, the City of Fishers will handle billing of residents for trash service. Residents can expect to see a single monthly bill including charges for both trash and sanitary services (if you are on Fishers sanitary sewer).

Many have asked if this will decrease our annual fees. At this time, the short answer is no; we anticipate Berkley Grove POA annual dues will remain the same as last year. While we budgeted for a 20% increase in monthly Republic Services expenses for 2024, when our contract renewed in July, the increase was actually 30%. We also learned later, that as all HOA contracts were renewed in 2024, the once a month free bulk pick-up clause was deleted from all HOA contracts. Therefore, if you do need a bulk pick-up, you will need to call Republic Services directly to schedule; the cost is \$45.



Holiday Schedule: There is NO trash or recycling pick-up on Memorial Day, Labor Day, July 4th, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, & New Year's Day.

Republic Services removed the free once/month bulk pick-up service on all renewing HOA contracts. Therefore, if you require bulk pick-up the cost presently is \$45.



Architectural Review Forms ...

Submit an Architectural Review Form as you begin planning **any** project that affects the outside of your home or yard (excluding routine landscaping, non-permanent playground

equipment, or if you are repainting your home or trim the exact same color). Per the Berkley Grove Covenants, Section 3(C), and Section 6 (A)(i), this form needs to be reviewed and approved by the Architectural Review Committee **before** your project begins.

Berkley Grove Covenants Common Violations

If you are in violation, you will receive notice

- Planning an outdoor project; submit an Architectural Review Form BEFORE project begins
- Maintain continuous dust-to-dawn lighting controlled by a photocell on the side of your garage or yard light
- <u>Trash Bins should not be visible from the</u> <u>street except on trash pick-up day</u>
- Cut down and remove all dead trees/shrubbery
- Keep the exterior of your residence in such a state of repair or maintenance as to avoid it from becoming unsightly including repair to rotting wood and flaking paint
- No trucks one (1) ton or larger in size, campers, trailers, boats, or similar vehicles shall be parked on the street. <u>Be</u> <u>advised of the City Ordinance making this a</u> <u>violation if parked visible of the street (in</u> <u>driveways).</u>

Be courteous of your neighbors and keep the sidewalk in front of your home free from snow and ice in the winter, tree limbs and lawn clippings in the warmer months.

Personal Safety:

- Be aware of your surroundings
- Always park in a visible area
- Never give out personal information

Home Safety:

- Leave on outside lights
- Invest in video doorbell
- Use timers on lights when not home
- Don't hide a key outside
- Ask a neighbor to watch your house
- Have your lawn mowed and packages picked up

Vehicle Safety:

- Don't leave valuables in car, including your garage door opener
- Park in well lit areas
- Never leave your keys in the car

From the Fishers Fire Department

Smoke Alarms are a key part of a home fire escape plan. When there is a fire, smoke spreads fast. Working smoke alarms give you early warning so you can get outside quickly.

Safety Tips:

- Replace all smoke alarms, including those that are hard-wired, when they are 10 years old
- Change batteries in all smoke alarms at least once per year
- Test all smoke alarms at least once a month. Press the test button to be sure the alarm is working
- It is best to use interconnected smoke alarms. When one smoke alarm sounds, they all sound.
